## 6:00 p.m. Public Hearing – FY2021 Spencer Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program Application - John O'Leary from PVPC

A motion to open the public hearing at 6:35 pm (Hicks/Howard) passed 4/0 with a roll call vote: Grigg-yes, Hicks-yes, Howard-yes Woodbury-yes

PVPC representative John O'Leary reported that they would like to submit a CDBG application on behalf of Spencer for the Valley and Mill Street infrastructure improvement project which will improve outdated infrastructure and the proposed replacement of water lines on Valley Street, installation of new fire hydrants, and connection of a new water line to adjoining streets to allow future improvements. Proposed surface improvements include roadway reconstruction, new or reset curb, sidewalks, and signage. The grant funding is for up to \$800,000 with the total estimated cost of \$1 million. The hope is for the Town to fund the difference, or phase in the additional amount of time.

Dr. Hicks asked why sewer infrastructure is not part of the project. Mr. O'Leary did not have the details on why sewer was excluded. Utilities & Facilities Superintendent Bill Cundiff pointed out that both the Sewer and Water Department were asked to provide feedback on this project. Mr. Grigg asked if sewer could be included in the next phase. Mr. O'Leary said it would depend upon the condition of the sewer infrastructure.

The hearing was opened to the public. Sewer Commissioner Frank White stated that there are issues with groundwater and not just the sewer pipes in the street. There were no other comments from the public.

### 6:15 p.m. National Grid Pole Hearing – Act on Request of National Grid to Install (1) SO Pole on Paxton Road, Plan #30079035

A motion to open the public hearing at 6:47 pm (Hicks/Howard) passed 4/0 with a roll call vote: Grigg-yes, Hicks-yes, Howard-yes Woodbury-yes

National Grid representative Laura Napolitano indicated that the request is for a new SO Pole at the intersection of Paxton Road and Lambs Grove to provide service to a new house at 155 Paxton Road.

Chairman Woodbury pointed out that there is service underground from pole #64 and asked about continuing that across to service 155 Paxton Road. Ms. Napolitano said it was addressed by the designer and the homeowner and this is the result of the final design.

Mr. Ross asked why the new pole was not going on private property. Ms. Napolitano said that primary service cannot be installed on private property and that legal questions were addressed in letter to Highway Foreman Eben Butler. There was some discussion on whether a private electric line will show up on dig safe reports. Mr. Butler said he does not object to the pole location since National Grid owns the line.

### Police Dept. Badge Pinning Ceremony for Sergeant Patrick Waugh

Chief Darrin reported that Patrick Waugh was the top candidate from a list of seven applicants and was appointed to sergeant in June. Ms. Waugh received his bachelor's degree and has been a fulltime police officer for nine years.

Mr. Waugh's mother, Debbie Waugh pinned her son's badge and the Board congratulated him.

### Review & Act to Authorize the Veteran's Agent to begin the Process for Spencer to become a Purple Heart Community

Veteran's Agent Scott Connor reported that there is a lack of recognition for a purple heart community in Spencer and he would like to change that. The home-based program involves submitting a Proclamation to the State and placing signage in areas around Town. The target date for completion is November 10<sup>th</sup> and a reading of the Proclamation will be done Veteran's Day, November 11, 2021.

Mr. Connor said it will cost \$750.00 to fund.

#### Update on Ambulance Service from the Spencer Rescue Squad

Pat George and Arnie Arsenault Jr. were present to provide an update on the Spencer Rescue Squad (SRS). Mr. George commended the SRS for their work during the pandemic noting that the organization is held in high esteem. He reported that activity over the past two years includes the purchase of two new ambulances and ongoing equipment and facility upgrades. There are approximately 2,000 calls for ambulance service each year. Mr. George said that the SRS is prepared to continue to the next contract period at the current rate of \$225,000 annually. Mr. Ross noted that the current SRS agreement runs through 2022 and both parties may mutually extend for an additional three years.

Matt Zarif with Timberyard Brewing was present to request a One-day Wine & Malt License during the Spencer Fair.

Mr. Woodbury said a drunken brawl at the Fairgrounds in the early 1990's created serious issues and since that time, there has been a commitment not to serve alcohol during the Fair and he is not in favor of issuing this license.

Mr. Zarif said he would have a cordoned off beer garden area, check identification, provide, wristbands and allow only two drinks per person. He pointed out that beer is an agricultural item and said he would take whatever measures the Board deems appropriate to ensure all are safe. Mr. Grigg asked if Mr. Zarif would be willing to hire a police detail to remain in the beer garden. Mr. Zarif said he would.

Chief Darrin said he is opposed to alcohol at the Fair noting that it is a family event and alcohol is not a good mix, however if the Board approves, he will have security in place.

Dr. Hicks mentioned that the Board recently approved alcohol at a child's dance recital, which he opposed and questioned why this event is different. There was some discussion on limiting hours. Chief Darrin pointed out the significant number of people attending the Fair in comparison to other events.

*Mr.* Grigg made a motion to approve a 1-day Malt License from 12 to 6 pm; it was not seconded.

A motion to deny the request for a 1-day Malt License (Howard/Hicks) passed 3/1 with a roll call vote: Grigg-no, Hicks-yes, Howard-yes Woodbury-yes

#### Review & Act on Request of Philip Stoddard to Release the CDBG Affordable Housing Restriction for 63 Main Street and to Authorize the Interim Town Administrator to Sign the Discharge of Affordable Housing Restriction

Mr. Ross reported that the property owned by Mr. Stoddard at 63 Main Street has an Affordable Housing Restriction and the tenant wants to purchase the property and keep as a single-family home, therefore the Restriction needs to be discharged and the balance remaining on the loan needs to be repaid.

### Review & Act on Use of COVID Rescue Funds to Complete the Inflow and Infiltration Study for the Sanitary Sewer System

Mr. Ross is recommending the use of up to \$260,000 from the COVID Rescue Funds to complete an Inflow and Infiltration Study for the Sanitary Sewer System. This will expedite the process which can be completed within six months. The Sewer Commissioners will authorize and manage all expenditures.

### Policy Introduction: Review Draft Policy for Public Comment during Board of Selectmen Meetings

Chairman Woodbury noted that a policy for public comment is needed to allow the Board to focus on the agenda. Citizen input is still encouraged and allowed as outlined in the draft policy.

Mr. Ross discussed with Town Counsel and was advised that issues occur in many communities relative to public comment. The Policy is intended to allow the Board enough time to conduct the official town business and that citizen input is not a time to debate or respond to comments. As a courtesy to other citizen's, no speaker may speak twice if others are waiting to speak. The Board will vote on the Policy at the next meeting.

#### Review & Act on Appointment for CMRPC Delegate & Alternate for FY2022

The FY2021 Delegate was Jonathan Viner; he is not interested in continuing. Mr. Grigg is willing to be the Delegate and Mr. Howard and he is willing to continue as the Alternate member.

A motion to appoint Mr. Grigg as the Board's Delegate and Mr. Howard as the Alternate to the CMRPC (Hicks/Howard) passed 4/0 with a roll call vote: Grigg-yes, Hicks-yes, Howard-yes Woodbury-yes

### Review Additional Workshop Meeting Dates for October 25<sup>th</sup>; November 29<sup>th</sup>; and December 20<sup>th</sup>

The Board reviewed the dates and agreed that December 20<sup>th</sup> will not be added.

A motion to approve Mr. Grigg as the Board's representative on the Pine Grove Cemetery Study Committee (Howard/Woodbury) passed 3/0. Mr. Grigg abstained.

#### Update on COVID-19 Cases

Chairman Woodbury said the Board would like to be informed on COVID case numbers monthly.

Dr. Hicks would like to have Health Agent Daoust provide an update at each meeting and noted his concern with the Delta variant.

### Town Administrator's Report

Mr. Ross reported the following:

- The remainder of the Covid funds will arrive this week and amounts to \$1.6 million.
- Charter removed cable lines on McCormick Road and are now waiting for Verizon.
- The Financial Policies manual was distributed to department heads.
- He will work with the Town Planner on an amendment to the Bylaw to correct the Planning Board fees.
- Charles Paquette was hired as the new Senior Clerk in the Treasurer/Collector's Office.

#### Citizen's Input

Lyn Stevens said she will deliver copies of Pine Grove Cemetery documents and title search records to Mr. Ross.

Matt Defosse, 7 Paul's Drive said he is hoping meetings continue in person and that folks can remain unmasked and stay six feet apart. He also thanked the family of Cole William Victor for their donation of a memorial pavilion at Powdermill Park.

Jonathon Viner, 34 Donnelly Cross Road requests that the Planning Board be placed on future agenda to discuss enforcement of special permits. He also noted that the Board had an executive session to discuss Mass Broken Stone and asked when the Board will take action on issues with Stantec, Howard Stein Hudson, and former Town employees. Chairman Woodbury said the Board cannot provide any information. The matter with Mass Broken Stone is being handled by Town Counsel and is confidential. Mr. Viner also asked if the Board going to discuss his public records request. Mr. Ross stated that he already provided a response to Mr. Viner and will fulfill the request upon receipt of payment or is willing to meet with Mr. Viner to discuss how to reduce the scope of the request.

Al Atchue, 98 Meadow Road spoke on the Board's Public Comment Policy and said he does not agree with placing limits on topics citizens would like to raise. Mr. Ross explained that is not the case, the public will be allowed comment, however the goal is to limit the length time to allow the Board take care of the business on their agenda.

#### **Board Member and Staff Comments**

Dr. Hicks said he is having issues with delays in the delivery of the Telegram and Gazette and asked residents who are also experiencing issues to email him and he will contact the Attorney General's Office.
